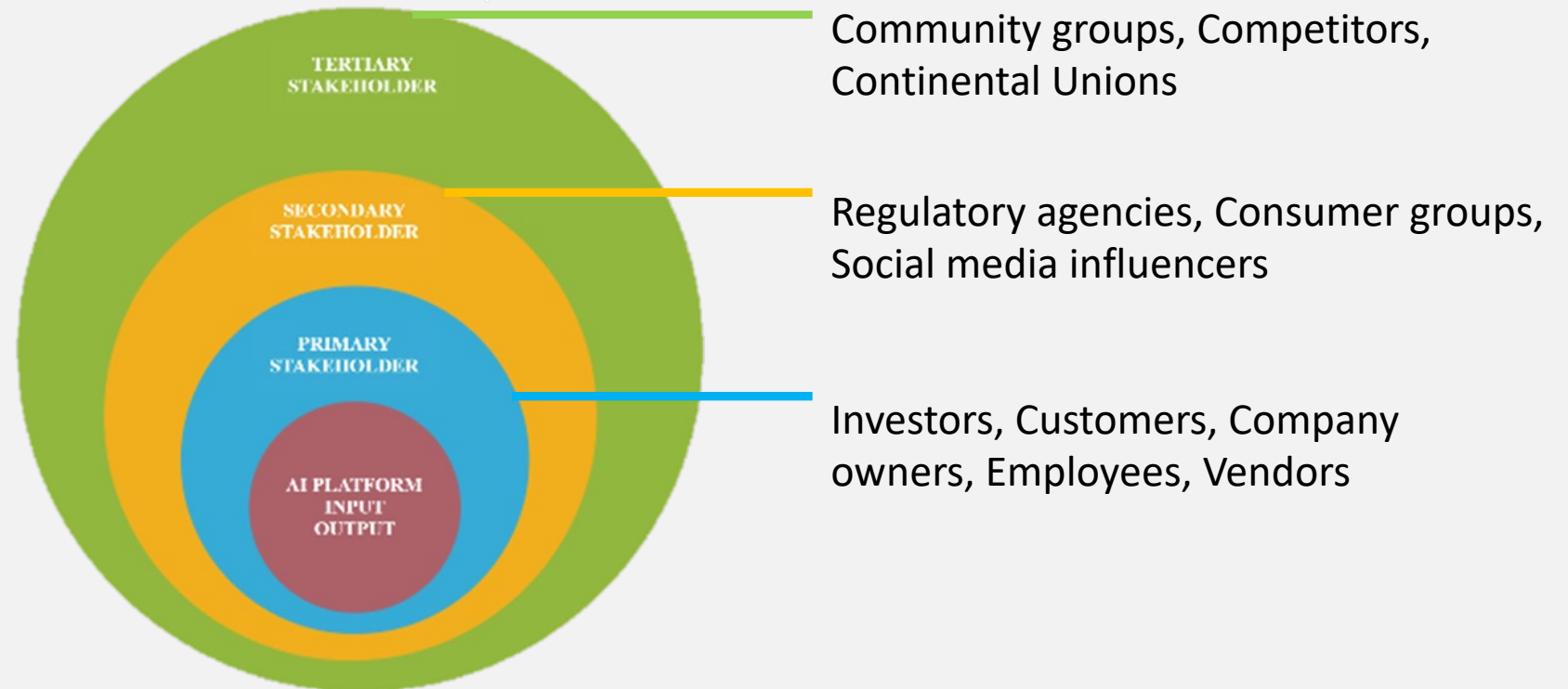
The Ecosystem Stakeholders

Stakeholders impact to and from AI project.

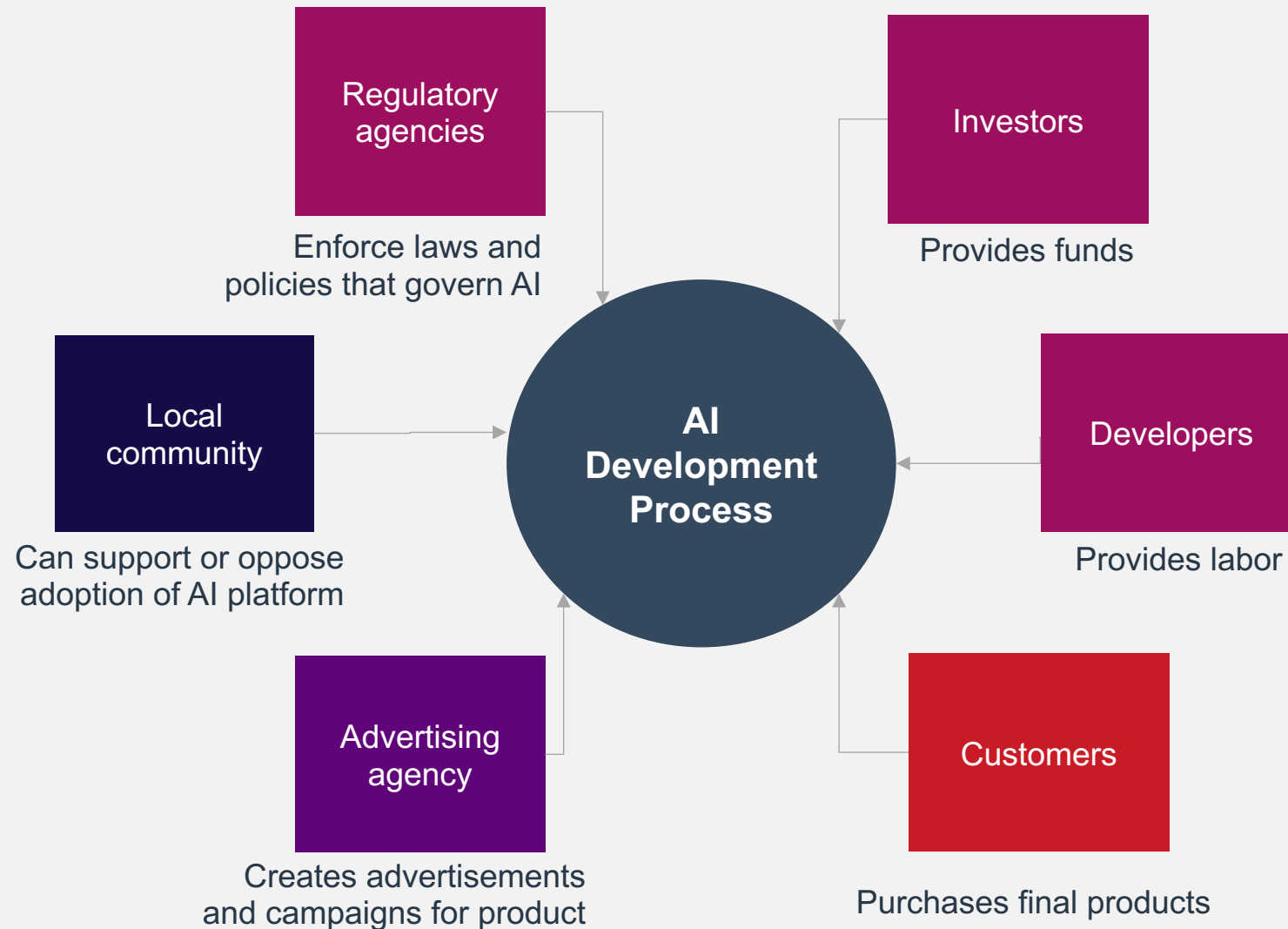
Primary are essential to the AI company/project; have direct input and directly impacted by the company's AI products.

Tertiary stakeholders even less so.



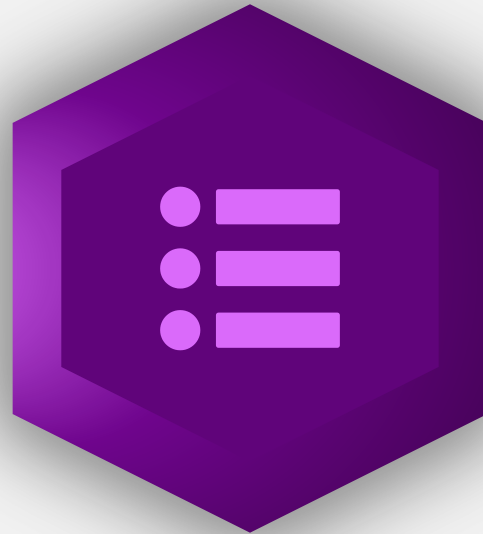
